During one of our weekly walks through the community of Travesia, Jeremy and I stopped to talk to a mom of a Rhino. After nearly 2 yrs of being here I have felt “life with them” Sometimes you don’t always see the fruits but sometimes they are smiling right back at you....Please pray that I can step out of the way for the Lord to continue to show me relationships with other women in the community.

Next month is our 2 year anniversary of being here in Honduras as missionaries. Our time here really has been a roller coaster. Emotions, trials, our mission has been full of ups and downs. I recently saw a photo of the early morning that we left Guatemala to be here in Honduras. Wow, the things that the "me" in that photo didn't know could crush someone. But the how and where God would grow me over these last two years have been the biggest "Wow!" Living in a foreign country, to learn the language, customs has been hard. What is acceptable, what is not acceptable and what is "normal" here has taken some getting used to. But the biggest change is understanding more and more the depth of the love of God. The true meaning of sacrifice and suffering. Being here has given me a whole new understanding of how hard living for Christ is. Not just being a Christian, but living for Christ. And we are not done. We are here until God calls us somewhere else. Not leaving, not moving, not running ahead of God's plan for our own plan.
